#### Salem Middle School (SMS) Commentary/Event Activities:

- Our enrollment as of today is 445 students.
- Effective School Solutions is fully operational and has been meeting with students and their parents to counsel and provide support.
- Professional development has continued with the American Reading Company and HMH Social Studies and support for our math and science teachers as well.
- ❖ The Start Strong Fall 2021 Assessments for grades 4-8 were administered October 5-7 and this week we are completing all make-up testing.
- ❖ Students eligible for Focus on Education have been identified and the program will begin on October 18th. And, on November 1st we will begin the 100 Book Challenge program with all of our students.

## Salem High School (SHS) Commentary/Event Activities:

- The administration of the PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) which is co-sponsored by the College Board and National Merit Scholarship Corp. was held today-October 13th. This test assesses reading, math and writing skills; provides excellent practice for the SAT (Scholastic Apititude Test); and connects students to scholarships and personalized online tools.
- The ACT Test was administered at Salem High School on Saturday, September 11th. A total of 44 SHS students took the test. Students completed the ACT Prep program this summer both remotely and person.
- ❖ Last week, Student Council hosted "A Storybook Homecoming Tales of Salem" Homecoming Spirit Week!
- Our Collegewise counselor, Mr. Chris LaBounty continues to work with our current Seniors submitting their college applications. All seniors are applying to a minimum of eight colleges by November 1st.
